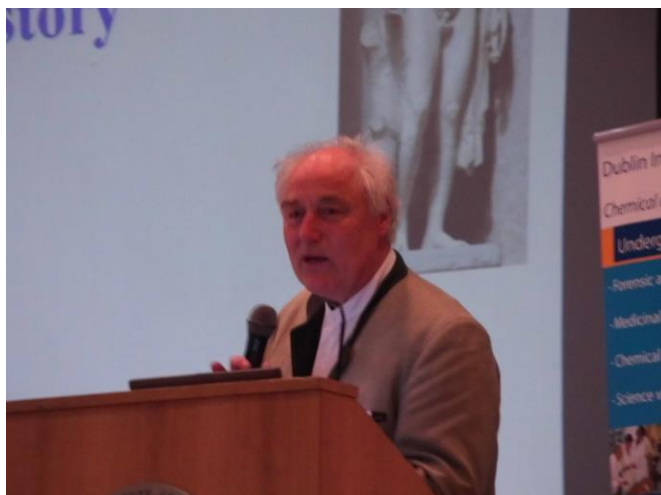

The 2017 Boyle-Higgins Gold Medal was awarded to Professor Henry Curran from University College Galway. His lecture, entitled "Developing Detailed Chemical Kinetic Mechanisms for Fuel Combustion" was given on April 27<sup>th</sup> at Royal College of Surgeons, on the day of the AGM.

This award, inaugurated in 2005, recognises the significant contribution to chemistry of an individual of international repute, who also has excellent skills in science communication. The 2017 recipient is Professor Donal O'Shea, From the Royal College of Surgeons of Ireland. He gave the first of his lectures as part of the first Symposium of the Irish Biological Inorganic Chemistry Society on 3<sup>rd</sup> November in NUI, Maynooth. His lecture was entitled "Learning how to turn the lights on; Target and responsive agents for fluorescence guided precision surgery" The lecture will be also given in NUIG on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> December and in Limerick early in the new year .

## *Institute of Chemistry of Ireland Industrial Chemistry Award 2017 Sponsored by Henkel Ireland*

**This award, inaugurated a number of years ago, is a high-level award for a chemist working in Ireland, in recognition of a substantial contribution to Ireland's Chemical or Pharmaceutical Industry. The winner of the 2017 award is Prof. Tom Moody representing the team from Almac Sciences, which along with a sister company, Arran Chemical Company synthesise speciality chemicals.**



Prof. Moody gave an inspiring presentation entitled "Enzyme "Feeds" Rapid Development and Commercialisation" at the joint awards seminar at the Albert Theatre of the RCSI on December 4<sup>th</sup>. In his talk, Prof. Moody outlined the recent advances in enzyme based organic synthesis.
