EuCheMS General Assembly 2012 and the Eva Philbin Annual Lecture Series 2012



10-12 October saw ICI host the EuCheMS General Assembly, following our successful bid in Serbia last year. EuCheMS (the European Association for Chemical and Molecular Sciences, <u>www.euchems.eu</u>) is the representative body for chemical societies in Europe, with over 40 members representing over 150,000 chemists. Its Secretariat in Brussels is ideally placed to promote the agenda of professional chemists to the EU, a facility of particular value to smaller organisations such as ICI.



Over 80 delegates came to the meeting, representing member societies and also Subject Divisions and Working Parties of EuCheMS. Chaired by *President Ulrich Schubert* (Vienna), the meeting was also attended by speaker invitees from several sister organisations, including the incoming President of the American Chemical Society, Marinda Wu, Professor Kazuyuki Tatsumi (President of IUPAC), Professor Luisa Cifarelli (President, European Physical Society), and Dr. Gernot Klotz (European Chemical Industry Council, CEFIC). The email you send should have "e-ICN registration" as the subject line, and should include the following 4 items: 1) Your full name; 2) Membership # (if you have it to hand); 3) Postal address registered with us (for confirmation; i.e. this should be the address on the mailout of this "Voice" newsletter; 4) Permission to send emails to you from third parties (i.e. YES or NO): if "YES", we may use your address to send you emails from third parties of material that may be of interest to members; if "NO", the address will only be used for e-ICN issues and other notifications of ICI events/business. Sample email content: 1) Joe Bloggs 2) M9999 3) 99 Chemistry St, Dublin 99 4) YES *(IF YOU DID THIS EARLIER IN 2012, YOU DON'T NEED TO DO IT AGAIN).*
