### **Institute of Chemistry of Ireland Congress 2015**

#### **Institute of Chemistry of Ireland Boyle Higgins Award 2015**

The 2015 Boyle-Higgins Gold Medal was awarded to Professor Dermot Diamond of DCU. His lecture, entitled "Chemical sensing with Autonomous Devices in Remote Locations: Why is it so difficult and how do we deliver revolutionary improvements in Performance?" was given on April 16<sup>th</sup> at DCU, on the day of the AGM. # The 67th Irish Universities Chemistry Research Colloquium, Maynooth University.

This is the longest-running event with which the Institute has been associated and it was hosted by NUIM at the end of June. We were happy to be numbered among the sponsors again this year. It provides a forum where we can learn about the amazing variety of research that is going on in our third level institutions on this island and we get it straight from the people who are getting down and dirty in the laboratories, the postgraduates themselves. The overall winner of The Institute of Chemistry of Ireland's award for the best oral presentation, sponsored by Chemglass, was Susan Dick of QUB. Her research presentation was entitled "Targeted β-phase formation in poly(fluorene) –ureasil grafted organic-inorganic ligands". ### Institute of Chemistry of Ireland Annual Lecture Award 2015 (Eva Philbin Lecture Series).



Professor Zaworotko at UCD

This award, now in its 10<sup>th</sup> year, recognises the significant contribution to chemistry of an individual of international repute, who also has excellent skills in science communication. The 2015 recipient is Professor Michael Zaworotko, who holds the Bernal Chair of Crystal Engineering at the University of Limerick. He gave the first of his lectures at UL during Science Week and the second at a joint awards seminar at UCD on November 26<sup>th</sup>. His lecture was entitled "Crystal Engineering of Task- Specific Materials" and began by giving a brief history of crystallography, before dealing with the generation of novel materials for various tasks, such as as multicomponent pharmaceutical materials, or porous materials for carbon capture and storage. The third lecture in the series will be given at a provincial venue early in the new year, so if you were not able to get to Dublin or Sligo, there will be a chance to hear it in 2016, at a venue to be confirmed later.

## Institute of Chemistry of Ireland Inaugural Industrial Chemistry Award Sponsored by Henkel Ireland

This was a first for the Institute and is intended as a high-level award for a chemist working in Ireland, in recognition of a substantial contribution to Ireland's Chemical/Pharmaceutical Industry. Henkel Ireland sponsored the €1000 award. The winner of this inaugural award is Donal Coveney of TopChem.



Donal gave an inspiring talk entitled "Jumping through hoops and chasing our tails – Challenges in securing market approval of Pharmaceutical Products" during Science Week at Sligo Institute of Technology. He repeated the lecture at the joint awards seminar at UCD on November 26<sup>th</sup> and he will also give the presentation at the premises of the sponsors, Henkel Ireland, in the near future.
